cupiditās, cupiditātis <i>f.</i>	desire, wish, longing, eagerness
cupīdō, cupidinis <i>f.</i>	desire, wish, longing, eagerness
ingenium, ingenīi, <i>n.</i>	talent, (innate) nature, character
iniūria, iniūriae <i>f.</i>	injury, harm; insult; wrong
opus, operis <i>n.</i>	work, labor, task
opus est (+ dat.)	there is a need / use (for)
mūrus, mūrī <i>m.</i>	wall; fortification wall for a city
*pons, pontis <i>m.</i>	bridge

Verbs

iungō, iungere, iūnxī, iūctus	to join, unite, connect; yoke
mentior, mentīrī, mentītus sum	to lie, speak <i>or</i> say falsely
moriō, morī, mortuus sum	to die

Adjectives

certus, certa, certum	fixed, established, certain; specified; reliable, sure
certē (adv.)	certainly, surely, of course; at least
quantus, quanta, quantum	how much

Adverbs

autem (<i>postpositive</i>)	however; on the contrary
cūr	why?
nē	not (<i>used with imperative & perfect subjunctive</i>)
quidem (<i>postpositive</i>)	indeed, certainly, in fact
nē ... quidem	not ... even
totiēns	so often

ut	in order that; so that
