poēta, poētae <i>m.</i>	poet
timor, timōris <i>m.</i>	fear, terror

crēdō, crēdere, crēdidī, crēditus	to believe, trust (+ dat. of <i>person believed</i> ; + acc. of <i>thing believed</i>)
finiō, finire, finivī, finītus	to end, finish; limit; die
fugiō, fugere, fūgī, fugitūrus	to flee (from), escape, avoid
incipiō, incipere, incēpī, inceptus	to begin
petō, petere, petivī or petī, petītus	to seek, go after; ask; attack
praebēō, praebēre, praebuī, praebitus	to show; offer, provide
relinquō, relinquere, reliquī, relictus	to leave, abandon
serviō, servīre, servivī or servī, servitūrus (+ dat.)	to serve

dexter, dextra, dextrum	right (side); right hand; pledge (of friendship)
